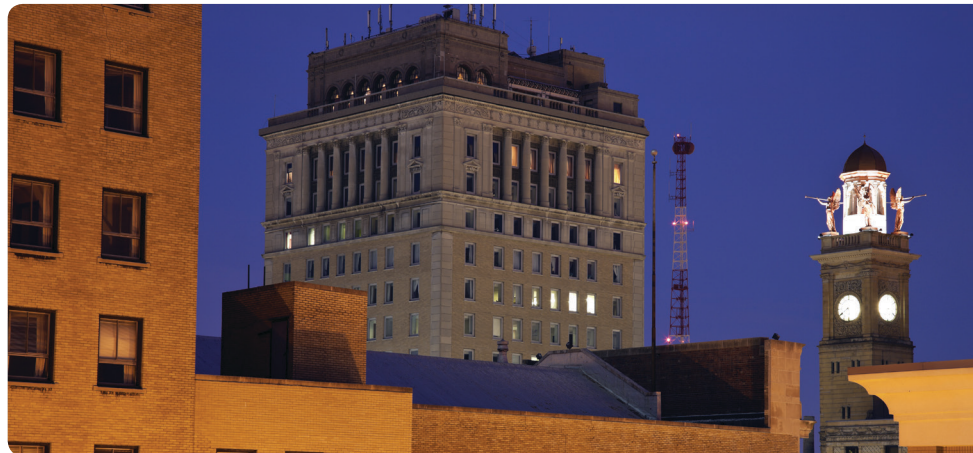


## Southeast Ohio Regional

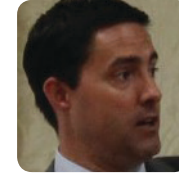

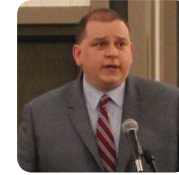
